NGWA Short-Term Medical Leave Status



Certified individuals who are in good standing may be placed on inactive status for up to 12 consecutive months (1 year) due to injury or short-term illness. During this inactive time, the individual may NOT engage in any groundwater industry activity that is covered by the NGWA Voluntary Certification Program. Once the individual comes off medical leave, the individual would have 12 months to fulfill the previous year's continuing education requirements along with all current year's requirements (fees, CEPs, and affidavit) to retain the certified status. If such requirements are not fulfilled during the 12-month period, then the individual will decertify.

If you wish to apply for medical leave, please fill out the Medical Leave Status Request Form and send it to NGWA so it is received by December 31 of the renewing year.
